Topic: Gurukulas to Global Vision [Tracing Indian Pedagogies from Veda to Vivekananda] & Charaka to Chandrasekhar [Scientific Legacy in Indian Knowledge Systems]

Gurukulas to Global Vision traces India's pedagogical evolution from the traditional gurukula model where students lived with gurus, learned through immersive practice, discipline, and daily service, and received holistic education in spiritual, linguistic, scientific, and moral domains to Swami Vivekananda's vision. Vivekananda emphasized "man-making education," advocating for character-building, self-reliance, service, and the realization of inner divinity, blending ancient wisdom with modern relevance.

Charaka to Chandrasekhar highlights India's deep scientific lineage. Charaka Samhita (c. 1st–2nd century CE) pioneered Ayurveda with its rigorous approach to diagnosis, pathology, therapeutics, and ecology. In modern times, scientists like Jayaraman Chandrasekhar have advanced computational and theoretical chemistry, earned prestigious awards and built on India's classical legacy.

Topic: Panini to Python [Sanskrit, Semantics, and Computational Insights] & Darshanas to Dictionaries [Philosophical Grammar in Indian Knowledge Systems].

Pāṇini's contributions were not mere descriptive — they were prescriptive and algorithmic. His rules allow:

Generating any grammatically correct Sanskrit sentence.

Analyzing (parsing) existing expressions.

Transforming root words (dhātus) into countless derivatives via affixation, inflection, and compounding.

Pratyāhāra-sūtras: using symbols from the Śiva Sūtras (like aC, haL) to compress large phonetic sets.

Technical terms (saṃjñā) and markers (anubandha) that were non-phonetic and purely grammatical.

This system is meta-linguistic, laying down not just rules, but rules about rules.

Think: meta-programming, long before Alan Turing.

“If Sanskrit is a programmable language, then Pāṇini is its compiler, and Aṣṭādhyāyī is the operating system.”

Morphology in linguistics refers to the study of the structure and formation of words.

Key Takeaway:

Indian semantics is not just about "what words mean," but how meaning itself is structured, transmitted, and experienced. It offers a complete science of speech and understanding, from phoneme to philosophy.





Science in Sanskrit

- Science requires a written language in which ideas can be written with great precision and logic. In ancient India Sanskrit was the language of science.
- Panini the grammarian in 5th century BC through his work on Sanskrit grammar, Ashtadhyayi gave the world Panini's Sanskrit also called as Classical Sanskrit or Laukika Sanskrit. This is different from Vedic Sanskrit.

How is Sanskrit Perfect for use in Computers:


- Grammar precise and well defined
- It is the only human language which has context free grammar. It means the meaning of an expression written in a grammar does not depend on the context in which it is used.
- While a human can understand the social context of a verb/expression, a computer program cannot.

Summary /Reflections:


- Scientific knowledge emanated from the Vedas and branched out into specialised subjects in Ancient India.
- Mathematics was explored and utilised in Fire altars, astrology and astronomy.
- Many concepts and discoveries attributed to western scientists were already well established in Ancient India.





A well-trained person in communication skills will effectively maintain his social and professional lives. In the globalized world, people are discovering the reality that technical skills without soft skills and communication skills would make them knowledge workers, not managers or leaders. Those who cannot communicate effectively will surely lose out: they get much less credit for their achievements than they desire.

At this backdrop, the department of English is organizing a Two-Day workshop on improving the communication skills of Technical and Non -Technical staff to sharpen their sensibility.

Detailed Proposal of The Workshop

An in-house workshop focused on improving communication skills for both technical and non-technical staff is a great initiative. It helps bridge gaps, fosters collaboration, and enhances overall productivity. Here's a structure for our workshop that can cater to both groups effectively:






