

Your I-20 Form is a very important document, which you should keep safe as you will need it throughout your time as an international student in the US.

SEVIS Fee

This fee is mandatory and must be paid before you attend your visa interview and enter the United States. This fee is not collected by UB; it supports the administrative expenses of SEVP and SEVIS. To pay the fee, visit www.fmjfee.com. Once paid, you should print your payment receipt and keep it with your I-20 Form and other materials that you will bring

Visa Interview

US Embassies and Consulates establish their own procedures for visa applications. There will be additional forms, fees, and document requirements outlined on that website.

Planning for Your Arrival

Your I-20 Form indicates your Program Start Date. This is the start of classes for the Spring 2024 semester. You are allowed to arrive within 30 days prior to the start of class, but not earlier. When planning for your arrival date, be sure to arrive before the start of your orientation program. Additional information on orientation will be provided to you by International Student Services in the near future.
